## Applying for primary places (Reception) to start September 2019

The on line application process will open on 1<sup>st</sup> November and runs until the deadline of 15th January 2019. Parents/carers should have received a letter and 'quick guide' from admissions inviting them to apply for a reception place.

Parents are able to apply for their child's reception place to start school in September 2019 using the online system: [www.leeds.gov.uk](http://www.leeds.gov.uk). After applying, please check that you have received a confirmation and keep the email safe. If you do not receive a confirmation email, this means that some of the information has been omitted and the application will not be processed, therefore you will need to contact Admissions.

Parents will be informed of their school offer via email on **Tuesday 16th April 2019.**
