### What we have been up to this week:-

Our Ofsted report is now official and I am pleased to be able to share that the report has confirmed that we continue to be a **good** school.

The report highlights the many strengths of the school and throughout the inspection it was made clear that nothing less than good teaching and good practice were seen. The areas for improvement identified are all those school is already in the process of addressing through this year's school development plan.

#### A few of the highlights include:

'Pupils are polite and give a warm welcome to visitors. Their behaviour around school is consistently good and they are helpful to one another.'

'Safeguarding training is delivered regularly to staff and governors, and staff know exactly what to do if they are worried about a pupil's welfare. You have effective systems in place that allow staff to share important information.'

'The curriculum you offer helps pupils to have a very good understanding of the different ways they can stay safe.'

'The English team work well together and have provided staff with support to teach writing...Leaders make regular checks on the quality of teaching and learning and have a clear understanding about what needs to improve.'

'The leaders for mathematics have reviewed the way that mathematics is taught and have introduced a new calculation policy. This ensures that pupils build upon the strategies they have learned and are more fluent with their mathematical skills.'

The areas for improvement are to ensure that:

- The proportion of pupils reaching the higher standards in writing at the end of key stage 2 increases so that it is at least in line with national average;
- Teachers plan mathematical tasks that accurately meet the needs of all pupils, particularly the most able;
- Teachers and other adults respond more effectively to the changing needs of pupils within lessons;
- Plans for use of the pupil premium funding are reviewed closely to ensure that the disadvantaged pupils make consistently good progress so that the gaps in their attainment compare to others in the school and nationally narrow.
