Social Media Safety and Privacy

We have had several occasions in school recently where it has been reported to us that children have accepted friends on social media platforms, when they are unaware of the person's identity. On several occasions, the unknown persons have communicated with the child and have asked for or shared inappropriate material. This can be reported to the police via 101.

We are concerned that some of our children are using social media platforms such as Facebook, Instagram, Snapchat, Tik Tok and some of the children who are using these platforms are not aware of how to set privacy settings to prevent putting themselves at risk. Below are the age restrictions for some of the most popular platforms.

Facebook-Age 13+

Instagram 13+

Tik Tok 13+

Snapchat 13+

In school, children are taught about internet safety regularly in class, in assemblies and through visits from outside providers such as 'D-Side'. Our children can tell us clearly what they need to do to keep themselves safe online but some children are not putting this knowledge in to practice on their own devices.

We would urge parents to check the social media platforms your children are using and have installed on their devices and to ensure that the highest level of security and privacy settings are used, should you allow them to continue using the platforms.
