What we have been up to this week:

The children are still all buzzing from Take Over Day last Friday and now Mrs Pattison has now stepped up to take on our School Council. Two children from each class are elected to be representatives for our School Council. They meet regularly to discuss any issues that have arisen and put forward suggestions for how things can be improved in school. Elections will take place in January.

In school we are currently reviewing our Behaviour Policy. We have amended our rules to make them more reflective of our school ethos:

- Respect everyone and everything.
- Keep yourself and others safe.
- Be responsible for your actions.
- Enable yourself and others to learn.

These are being disseminated through our school Assemblies to ensure the children know and understand them and can follow them effectively.

We are reviewing negative dojos and when they will be given. EYFS and Key Stage 1 no longer have negative dojos. The ones given in Key Stage 2 will be associated with specific behaviour incidents such as swearing or physically hurting others, or continuous poor behaviour choices over throughout the day.

We want to make sure that behaviour is dealt with consistently and effectively across school and that parents/carers are involved in that process. We have therefore introduced a reporting system for the minority of children who need help modifying and managing their behaviour.

Copies of our new policy will be shared on our website and Tapestry as soon as it is finalised. From January 2018 it will be fully implemented across school.

I am sorry that some parents/carers are unhappy that we are not having a Christmas Sing for our Key Stage 2 children, but I am sure you will enjoy their Concert next term. We will review our plans for next year after that.
