

Girls' Football St Bart's Cup

Yesterday, twelve of the girls' football team, travelled to Leeds to participate in the annual St. Bart's Cup. This is a massive, girls only event, in which schools from all across the city take part. This year there were 58 teams playing, which were split into nine groups. Each group played either five or six games which were seven minutes long. The games were played in the small, outdoor, astroturf pitches (cages), which made them very fast-paced and the girls had to learn to use the sides as a rebound for the ball.

Our girls were split into two teams, A and B. They played in separate groups but were on pitches next to each other. The competition was extremely tough for both teams, but the girls played so well together, becoming better and better as each game went on. Their confidence grew with every kick of the ball and they became so much more resilient because of this.

Absolutely fantastic goals from Amelia, Paige and Sienna throughout the tournament, along with superb saves from the goalies, gave the teams respectable finishing positions in their groups. Team A's last three games were completely dominated by them and they very were unlucky to lose 1-0 in two of them due to 'flooky' goals!

This was the first time that some of the girls had been part of such a huge tournament and they all really enjoyed the experience. It was an absolute pleasure having them represent our school so well.

Dear parents,

Measles outbreaks and importance of MMR vaccination this Summer

You may be aware that measles is currently circulating in Yorkshire with cases seen in children and young adults in Leeds and Bradford. There are also measles outbreaks in other parts of the UK and in some countries in Europe, so we are encouraging parents to ensure all children are up-to-date with MMR vaccination prior to the summer months when travel is at its peak.

Measles is extremely infectious and can be serious for some people. Public Health England has the following advice:

- The best way to protect you and your family from measles is with the measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccination. This vaccine is usually given at 1 year of age, with a second dose at around 3 years and 5 months, as part of the NHS Childhood Immunisation Programme. Please check you are all up to date by checking your child's red book, or contacting your GP surgery if you're unsure. MMR vaccine can be given to adults of any age.
- If you, or anyone in your family, aren't up-to-date with the vaccine, this can be arranged with your GP surgery. We are encouraging all people in Leeds to do this now, particularly if they are planning to travel or go to festivals over the summer. It is never too late to vaccinate because measles can be serious at any age.
- Be aware of the symptoms of measles, and if you have symptoms, stay at home and phone your GP or NHS 111 for advice. STAY AWAY from schools, nursery and childminder settings and GP surgeries and A&E departments because measles is extremely infectious, you could spread the illness to others.
- Symptoms of measles include: high fever; sore, red, watery eyes; coughing; aching and feeling generally unwell; a blotchy red brown rash, which usually appears after the initial symptoms.
