### What we have been up to this week:

As many of you will know we have had a lot of children out of school this week with covid. We have had some staff affected but we hope that if we can slow the progress of covid through school it will help us maintain manageable staffing levels.

Unfortunately many people are struggling to get PCR tests, and at times the results are slow at coming through. We are keen to make sure that we are able to continue as normally as possible for the children without losing any of the fun things we have planned.

Please bear with us and try to keep us informed of any positive lateral flow tests so that we can at least keep track of possible cases. Work is provided for children who are well enough to access it whilst they are off. If your child has a negative lateral flow they are able to come into school unless they develop symptoms. It is still the case that all children with symptoms must have a PCR test.

Despite the covid doom and gloom this week has still seen lots of excitement in school with Year 1 designing and making extreme environments on their WOW day to start their topic on Extreme Places. The children were bursting with ideas and spent a lot of time and put a lot of effort into their designing and making.

Year 2 also put their designing and making skills to good use as part of their WOW day; although they all harnessed their inner superhero to design superhero badges to launch their Superhero topic.

Meanwhile, Year 3 found a dragon egg in the Forest School which had already hatched so they are now all on the look-out for signs of a dragon living down there. I'm not sure if they've managed to catch a glimpse of it yet, but I know they've spotted scratches on the trees down there.

As always we have not been put off by the weather and the children have all been in rain and snow this week. 

### Covid-19 Update

You will be aware from all the media coverage around changes to testing and isolation rules alongside the return to school. We are working hard to keep school open in the current situation. This is not an easy task. We are seeing increased levels of staff absence across all areas of the school.

Because of our staffing levels, you may see that it is taking us longer to answer phones, and respond to your queries. Please use email communications where possible and we will endeavor to respond as quickly as possible.

Should teaching staff levels significantly drop, there may be a need to switch to remote learning. This may be for certain classes or year groups and such a decision is likely to be at short notice. We will not make this decision lightly, and we ask you to bear with us.

In addition, and in line with all recommended guidance, we have contingency plans in place to be able to switch to remote learning and critical keyworker care should there be an enforced school closure.

Thank you for your patience and understanding.


### Testing, Self Isolation and Returning to school

### LFD Testing

If your child tests positive using a lateral flow test, they should remain at home and follow self isolation guidelines. The test result should be reported using the government website: Report a COVID-19 rapid lateral flow test result - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)



### Appying for Primary places (Reception) to start September 2022

The on line application process opened on 1st November and runs until the deadline of 15th January 2022. Parents/carers should have received a letter and 'quick guide' from admissions inviting them to apply for a reception place. Parents are able to apply for their child's reception place to start school in September 2022 using the online system: <a href="www.leeds.gov.uk">www.leeds.gov.uk</a>. After applying, please check that you have received a confirmation and keep the email safe. If you do not receive a confirmation email, this means that some of the information has been omitted and the application will not be processed, therefore you will need to contact Admissions.

Parents will be informed of their school offer via email on Tuesday 19th April 2022.

Please remember to:

- use all 5 preferences, using only use 1 or 2 preferences decreases the chances of being offered a place at a preferred school;
- any supplementary information needs to be provided by the closing date (this applies if a child is previously looked after, is seeking admission under exceptional needs or if a family

wish to apply for their child to be admitted out of chronological age group

• use the child's actual permanent address. Using that of a friend, relatives, childminder or renting a property to gain a school place are all considered fraud and places can be with drawn.
