Congratulations to Class 9 who have 99.2% attendance this week - you were our attendance stars.

What we have been up to this week:

This week has been Assessment Week in school so that we know where the children are in their learning in English and mathematics ready for them moving to their new classes. We use the data to inform our reports and the results will be shared with you through the reports. We also use the papers to look for gaps in learning; gaps for the whole class or cohort but also for individual children.

We also use assessment data to inform the classes for the next academic year. We will be reorganising all our classes for next year based on the needs and abilities of the children. We do pay attention to friendships but your child will not necessarily be with the children they play with in the playground or outside of school. Each year group is outside together for half and hour in the morning and half and hour Ace Club time, so there will be plenty of opportunity for them to mix and socialise with their friends in the other class. The children in Reception and Year 1 are mixed throughout the day and only spend short amounts of teaching time in their own class.

As always we have lots of fun activities and events planned right up to the end of term. This week some of our Year 2 children were involved in a skipping competition and all had a fantastic time sharing both their individual skills and team work. We were very proud of the effort they put into learning all the different skipping skills.

We have had a few instances both in and out of school recently of children putting themselves and others in danger when out playing out before or after school. Whilst these incidents have all been dealt with by school we felt it was something that all the children would benefit from some advice and support on. We have therefore asked our local PCSO to talk to all the children in Year 5 and 6 about anti-social behaviour and what they can do to keep themselves safe and how to report anything they witness.

We have also had a lot of children off on holiday over the last few weeks; some without letting school know. Please make sure you are honest with school about why you are taking your child out of school so that you are not asking them to hide things or to lie to us. You may be fined for taking holidays in term time, but your child will not be judged or treated differently because of it.
